ABOUT LYLE BEST:

An entrepreneur and corporate leader, Lyle Best is a model of community spirit, social responsibility, and generosity.

He has served in leadership roles with charitable, sports and community organizations, including the Edmonton Oilers Hockey Club, Kids with Cancer, and the University of Alberta, among many others. Order of Canada recipient in 2008.

For the past 23 years one way he's served the Canadian dental community has been as a member of the CDSPI Board—the past 15 years as Chair. In April 2021 he announced he would be leaving the Board.

PURPOSE

The Lyle Best Humanitarian Award was established in 2018. Given to an individual(s), dental practice or organization in Canada who has had a profound impact on the dental health of impoverished populations nationally or internationally. \$15,000 awarded to aid in the continued effort of providing dental care to that population.



Humanitarian Award Criteria

- Direct involvement in delivering oral health care to underserved and at-risk populations in Canada or internationally
- Dedication to improving the oral health and well-being of others.
- Significant involvement with the preparation, prevention and/or response to natural and/or man-made disasters and emergency situations where oral health care is needed.

Recipient

The recipient shall be recognized as having:

- a. A significant impact on the oral health outcomes of others;
- b. Evidenced concern about human beings in special ways through caring behavior, documented and generally recognized by peers;
- c. Involvement over a period of time in delivering care to underserved or at-risk populations which benefits others, not self.

NOMINATION PROCEDURES

1. Nominations may be submitted by an organization, dental practice, or individual dentist. The Nomination package should contain the following components:
 - a. A letter of nomination clearly reflecting the reason for being nominated.
 - b. Information about the program, dental mission, and/or project
 - c. Up to three letters of support may be submitted to provide additional information in support of the nominee.
 - d. Supporting materials limited to 10 pages and contain information that clearly indicate the background, activities, commitment, experience and passion of the nominee.
 - e. Nomination packet (or notebook) should be organized according to the following guidelines:
 1. Cover page
 2. Nomination letter
 3. Table of contents
 4. Detailed information about the program, dental mission, and/or project
 5. Supporting letters (limit of three letters)
 6. Supporting documentation in the form of a narrative (not to exceed 10 pages)
- f. Deadline for nomination is Friday, September 2nd, 2022.
